Dear Families

How lucky have I been? Coming back to a place which I have such great memories of during a time of further improvements – new admin building. When I arrived to meet with Luke during Week 9 I could not believe the amazing changes which had taken place, grounds, classrooms, hall. Then I was informed that the only place I recognised, the admin area, was awaiting a transformation. You must all be so proud of the facilities which you and your children get to share.

In Week 11 there was a lot going on in prep for the renovations, for example the relocation of the admin area into the Yr 5/6 classroom. It

was a smooth transition as Luke had planned this extremely well and the staff worked really well together in a cooperative way. Work commenced late during Week 11 and has continued during the holiday period. The staff and students have returned to a very active work site with a proposed finish date of the end of Week 2. I would like to thank the staff for their cooperation, input, help and patience during this period of change.

During the holidays an arborists undertook work on the tree in the playground – ensuring its safety and longevity, as mentioned – the builders maintained their progress, our school was well represented by staff and students as they laid a wreath at the Yorketown ANZAC Day Ceremony – an action that will take on even more relevance to our senior class as they take part in a visit to the Canberra War Memorial as part of their Canberra Trip. Again, I was impressed that staff and students were quick to take up the invitation to attend the service and represent the school.

This week we have welcomed Keyara Tucker (Mon & Tues) and Ash Biddell (Wed, Thur, Fri) as teachers of the Yr 3/4 class. (We also thank Ngaire Bernhardt as she is assisting during Week 1). Re: Federal Election, 3rd May 2025

Grace and peace, I hope this note finds you well.

As you may be aware the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has released an Election Statement 2025 - **'Called to bring hope in the Year of Jubilee'**. Please click the link to access the Election Statement <u>Election Statement 2025</u>

Our faith calls us to engage in democracy, to build, in the words of Pope St John Paul II, "a civilisation of love" and to contribute "to the good of society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom".

This election coincides with the Holy Year of Jubilee, themed 'Pilgrims of Hope.' Pope Francis reminds us that "all of us have received the gift and task of bringing hope wherever hope has been lost, lives broken, promises unkept, dreams shattered, and hearts overwhelmed by adversity."

To bring hope, we must first become people of hope; as Pope Benedict XVI declared: "The one who has hope lives differently." The Jubilee reminds us that voting is not just a civic duty but an opportunity to advance the common good and pave the way for hope.

With this in mind, we call to our consciousness the 54,000 young people educated in our Catholic schools, the 20,000 people supported by Centacare Catholic Community Services, those who we reach out to in prisons, hospitals and nursing homes and those who are in need of the basics of shelter and food. It is important that we continue to advance the common good in these areas.

Education is always a prominent topic in election campaigns and the National Catholic Education Commission, together with Catholic Education SA, has identified key issues and priorities for our school communities. Underlying these priorities is the recognition that Catholic schools save taxpayers billions of dollars and ease pressure on government-run schools. To remain sustainable, we need the government to provide continued policy stability and funding certainty.

I encourage you to find out as much as possible about your local candidates' views on issues that we, as Catholics, are compelled to uphold, including the sanctity of life, caring for the vulnerable, support for families, fostering a just society and responsible stewardship of God's creation.

Our school has been lucky enough to receive a huge parcel of food tech equipment from OzHarvest to support the 'FEAST' program.

We have received \$1300 worth of equipment, and will also receive a \$350 Woolworths voucher to spend on ingredients to support the program. The FEAST program will be rolled out across the school in our food tech lessons, and will also support learning within the school garden and Green Space. FEAST aims to incorporate sustainability and food waste prevention into schools, encouraging students to have a connection with food preparation, and will build on our existing foundation of kitchen and gardening understanding, and safety procedures.

This is a really exciting opportunity to extend our already flourishing Food Tech program, and support students to further increase their knowledge and experience in the kitchen and the garden.



Nature Studio


